

Key Information

Joint Project – AT/ NZTA / Auckland Council

- Connections to train stations at Orakei, Meadowbank and Glen Innes
- Connections to suburbs of Meadowbank, Kohimarmara, St Johns, Glen Innes and Stonefields
- Connects Metro Network in the Eastern corridor and through to AMETI
- Proposed shared path Approximately 3.5 m wide
- Initial demand 300 cyclist per day / 9000 per month
- Future anticipated demand 900 cyclist per day / 27,000 per month
- Walking demand various flows with peaks





Draft Programme

- Scheme Assessment Report (SAR) underway
- Historic approach preliminary design, consenting, property, detailed design and construction over a 6 to 7 year period.
- Proposed approach integrated NZTA/AT under one PM (planned 3-4yrs)
 - Section 1 (Mechanics Bay to Orakei Point) 3 to 4 years
 - Section 2 (Orakei Point to Meadowbank Station) 2 years
 - Section 3 (Orakei Point to Purewa Cemetery) 3 years
 - Section 4 (Purewa Cemetery to St Johns Road) 3 years
 - Section 5 (ST Johns Road to Glen Innes) 2 years
- Subject to funding and consent/property
- Further detail to follow SAR options analysis




Stakeholder Engagement
